Women in Rotary

Until 1989, the Constitution and By-laws of Rotary International stated that Rotary club membership was for males only. In 1978 the Rotary Club of Duarte, California, invited three women to become members. The R.I. board withdrew the charter of that club for violation of the R.I. Constitution. The club brought suit against R.I. claiming a violation of a state civil rights law which prevents discrimination of any form in business establishments or public accommodations. The appeals court and the California Supreme Court supported the Duarte position that Rotary could not remove the club's charter merely for inducting women into the club. The United States Supreme Court upheld the California court indicating that Rotary clubs do have a "business purpose" and are in some ways public-type organizations. This action therefore allowed women to become Rotarians in any jurisdiction having similar "public accommodation" statutes. The R.I. constitutional change was made at the 1989 Council on Legislation, with a vote to eliminate the "male only" provision for all of Rotary.

Lynda Reynolds

Lynda joined the club in July of 1998, becoming the third female in the club. (With the resignations of Jo Ann Jones and Elizabeth Hines, she's now the "senior" female!) She is Vice President of the Milledgeville campus of Central Georgia Technical College. She serves as chief operating officer with primary responsibility for the academic programs. She has been with CGTC since September of 1997 when she was hired as Director of Student Services. A long-time advocate of adult/technical education, she has been with that area of higher education since 1984 when "technical schools" were under the supervision of the secondary school system. She has been involved in the evolution of vocational schools to technical schools and now technical colleges. Educating the public about the changes in technical education is an ongoing process, according to Lynda. The Milledgeville CGTC services approximately 1000 students and now offers associate degrees. Lynda aspired to become a Rotarian while working as Vice President for Student Services at Heart of Georgia Technical College. The President was a Rotarian and kept the Four-Way Test on his wall. Lynda has served as director of Vocational Service for Milledgeville Rotary, and is happy to see more females being admitted to the club. Advice for new members? She said that as a new member she made a conscious effort to sit at different tables each week to get to know fellow Rotarians, and to extend her network. Lynda is the proud mother of a son, a first-year law student at Mercer University.
