TODAY'S MEETING

STAR STUDENT

STAR (Student Teacher Achievement Recognition) program is in its 58th year and honors Georgia's highest achieving high school seniors and the teachers who have been most instrumental in their academic development. Every accredited high school in Georgia is eligible to participate in this program. Since its inception, the STAR program has honored nearly 25,500 students and the teachers they have selected as having had the most influence on their academic achievement.

To obtain the STAR nomination. high school students must have the highest score on and single test date of the three-part SAT taken through November of their senior year and be in the top 10 percent or top 10 students of their class based on grade point average. Nominee's SAT scores must be equal to or higher than the latest available national average on the critical reading, math and writing sections. Each STAR Student is asked to name his/her START Teacher. High school STAR Students compete for system titles and System STAR Students in turn compete for region-wide honors in the 12 STAR Regions. Region winners and their STAR Teacher are invited to Atlanta to compete for the state STAR scholarships and awards.
