 Rotarian Jim Johnson introduced his former colleague, Tommy Morris, who is the Georgia Area Director for Social Security.



**Tommy Morris, Ron Colvin, Jim Johnson, Arthur Gunn** and Tommy encouraged us to let David know how the office is doing.

Nationwide, the Social Security Administration has gone from 80,000 employees in the 1980's to 65,000 today. Administrative costs are less than 2% of the taxes taken in.

Tommy is absolutely sure that there will continue to be Social Security payments, but encouraged a retirement package of savings, Social Security and private pension.

In this area, there are 95,000 people in a four-county area and 18,137 people are paid \$13.3 million a month in Social Security payments.

Ron Colvin, the computer authority for Social Security in Georgia, was also introduced. The system has been modernized with a state-of-the-art computer system and enhanced technology.

**Rotarian that made the news!!**

**Beth Payne, a Rotarian with deep roots in international service, is the first U.S. consul in postwar Iraq.**

Rotarian Beth Payne is no stranger to international hot spots, having served the U.S. Department of State in Israel, Kuwait, and Rwanda.

But her current assignment may present the ultimate test of her ability to perform under pressure. The 37-year-old member of the Rotary Club of Washington, D.C., recently was named the first U.S. consul to postwar Iraq, temporarily attached to the Defense Department's Office of Reconstruction and Humanitarian Assistance. Her main duties are to aid and protect U.S. private citizens in Iraq and process U.S. visa requests. Creation of a consular affairs office is seen as an important early step in the troubled nation's rebuilding process.
