Program: **Rev. Dewey Norton**
 Rotarian Ed Hall introduced Dewey Norton, former pastor of First Baptist Church who presented a program, "Reflections on Korean Experiences." Norton grew up in Savannah, a city that loved the Marine Corps and the men who served in it. He is a Mercer University graduate and attended seminary at Wake Forest.

 He joined the Marine Corps Reserve, not only to avoid the draft, but because reservists also received two pairs of shoes when they joined. After serving for a year and a half he was activated in August 1950, a month after the Korean War started. He attended basic training at Camp Pendleton in California and was a mortar man by training. A Sgt. Maj. assigned him to a chaplain as a chaplain's assistant. During one encounter, three chaplains were wounded, three chaplains' assistants were wounded and one was killed. Nearly one million U.S. and U.N. troops were killed, wounded or missing in action during the three-year conflict. Dewey returned last summer to South Korea for the 50-year observance of the Armistice signing. He spent a great deal of the visit talking and visiting with South Koreans and his relationships with many of them are among his highlights of the trip.

Four Avenues of Service

The term "four Avenues of Service" is frequently used in Rotary literature and information. The "Avenues" refer to the four elements of the Object of Rotary: Club Service, Vocational Service, Community Service and International Service. Although the Avenues of Service are not found in any formal part of the constitutional documents of Rotary, the concept has been accepted as a means to describe the primary areas of Rotary activity.

"Club Service" involves all of the activities necessary for Rotarians to perform to make their club function successfully. "Vocational Service" is a description of the opportunity each Rotarian has to represent the dignity and utility of one's vocation to the other members of the club. "Community Service" pertains to those activities which Rotarians undertake to improve the quality of life in their community. It frequently involves assistance to youth, the aged, handicapped and others who look to Rotary as a source of hope for a better life. The Fourth Avenue "International Service" describes the many programs and activities which Rotarians undertake to advance international understanding, goodwill and peace. International Service projects are designed to meet humanitarian needs of people in many lands. When a Rotarian understands and travels down the "Four Avenues of Service," the Object of Rotary takes on even greater meaning.

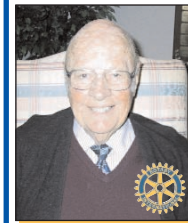

MEMBER PROFILE

Fielding Whipple

Fielding joined Milledgeville Rotary after "moving to town" 39 years ago. He was recently honored by the club for 37 years of perfect attendance. The secret to perfect attendance, according to him, is his good health and the good health of his family. Fielding graduated from the University of Georgia with a degree in journalism and had a job for the papers in Thomaston, GA. He was called into active duty to serve in the Korean War and when he returned to the states, his newspaper job was gone. He then entered the office supply business in Dublin with his brother. Fielding's territory covered much of southern Georgia and he often drove 1,000 miles a week. He moved to Milledgeville in 1964 and has been in his present location (100 E. Hancock) for 28 years. He handles sales and has two technicians who are in charge of repairs. He said they won't let him hold a screwdriver. He met his wife, Harriet, when she was the GC&SU representative on the board of the Milledgeville Community Concert Association, of which Fielding was president. They married in August 1971, the year he served as president of the Milledgeville Rotary club, after a whirlwind courtship of two weeks. "When you get a good one, you better hold on to her." They are parents of two grown children, Field, 30, and Ann, 28, and the extremely proud grandparents of grandson, Jackson, 6 months old. Fielding says the best thing to happen to the Rotary Club here was the admission of female members because they really pitch in, get involved and get a lot of work accomplished.
