Rotarian Fielding Whipple introduced Dr. Tom Toney, professor of biology at GC&SU, and his wife "soon-to-be Dr." Ellie Toney who presented a program on mechanical musical memories. The Toneys, who have an extensive collection of working, antique phonographs and music boxes, demonstrated with several pieces of the collection (some had to be hand-cranked) the variety of ways music was produced prior to record players, tape players and DVD's. Ellie, a sociology Ph.D. candidate, described their process of acquiring pieces as more of an "addiction" than a collection. Tom gave the history of phonographs. Thomas Edison was first to produce sound on a phonograph but the focus was for business/education purposes as opposed to entertainment. Edison owned the term "phonograph" until the late 1920's. It wasn't until the 1880's that phonographs were developed and marketed for entertainment purposes.

- The first Rotary club outside of North America was chartered in Dublin, Ireland, in 1911.
- The first Rotary club in a non-English-speaking country was in Havana, Cuba, in 1916.
