She explained that the Bobcat Brass is a select group of brass students at GC&SU. Performing for the club

The first three selections were brass pieces from the Renaissance and including Lo' How a Rose is Blooming, the oldest surviving Christmas carol. Before performing Duke Ellington's "Mood Indigo," Dr. Horgan explained that the jazz tradition requires some improvisation. The jazz program at GC&SU is very good, so the Bobcat Brass has been well trained.

The next selection was Dr. Horgan's arrangement of "Over the Rainbow," arranged for her brother-in-law's memorial service, followed by the final piece, "Mississippi Rag."

Rotarian that made the news!!

Roger Noel- The Department of Modern Foreign Languages in the School of Liberal Arts and Sciences won a first-place award for its submission in the "Best Practices in International Education: Most Internationalized Academic Unit" category.

The committee commended the Department of Modern Foreign Languages for requiring that students study abroad, for the inclusion of international experience in its faculty and promotion guidelines, and for the professional development and activities of the faculty in the department.

The first-place winners were each awarded a \$5,000 prize, intended for use in strengthening international programs.

ROTARY MOTTOES

The first motto of Rotary International, "He Profits Most Who Serves Best," was approved at the second Rotary Convention, held in Portland, Oregon, in August 1911. The phrase was first stated by a Chicago Rotarian, Art Sheldon, who made a speech in 1910 which included the remark, "He profits most who serves his fellows best." At about the same time, Ben Collins, president of the Rotary Club of Minneapolis, Minnesota, commented that the proper way to organize a Rotary club was through the principle his club had adopted--"Service, Not Self." These two slogans, slightly modified, were formally approved to be the official mottoes of Rotary at the 1950 Convention in Detroit--"He Profits Most Who Serves Best" and "Service Above Self." The 1989 Council on Legislation established "Service Above Self" as the principal motto of Rotary, since it best explains the philosophy of unselfish volunteer service.
